



The Public Works Department at Incarnation School Science Fair

On February 23 and 24, personnel from Glendale's Public Works Department served as judges for the Incarnation School Science Fair. For the past ten years, Public Works officials have enthusiastically volunteered to judge 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th and 8th grade science projects.

Judges Maurice Oillataguerre, Mark Price, Arthur Asaturyan, Steve Morris, Bobby Supan and Rick Beltran, teamed with several parent volunteers, were literally put to the test themselves, grading a larger number of entries (over 100) than last year.

The projects themselves, encompassed a wide variety of sophistication, original thought and imagination, including such project titles as, "Do White Candles Burn Faster Than Colored Candles?", "Oil Spills", "How The Sun's Position Affects Solar Power", "Cloud In A Bottle", Spiders On Caffeine", and "The Truth About Power Bars."

As part of the project criteria, each student team was required to make an oral presentation for the judges on the subject topic.

After three hours of review, each judge turned in their project evaluations and tabulations.

The two day event was clearly a unique opportunity for Public Works officials to volunteer their time for a worthy endeavor. They look forward to being invited back next year.
